Purpose

This form is used to apply for a Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant. You must be enrolled in a TEACH Grant eligible program in order to receive this grant and then teach as a high-qualified teacher, in a high-need field, at a low-income elementary or secondary school for four years within eight years of completing the program. If you receive the TEACH Grant and fail to meet the requirements, the grant will convert into an Unsubsidized Loan, with interest accrued and capitalized from the date of original disbursement. 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What is a TEACH Grant?

- The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant provides grants of up to \$4,000 a year to students who are completing or plan to complete course work needed to begin a career in teaching. This grant requires you to be enrolled in a TEACH Grant eligible program in order to apply.

What are the eligibility requirements to receive a TEACH Grant?

- Meet the basic eligibility criteria for the federal student aid programs
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Be admitted and enrolled in the fourth year of the Liberal Studies Teaching and Learning: Integrated Teacher Education Preparation (ITEP) Program, admitted and enrolled in Teaching Credential Program or the Master of Arts in Education Program specializing in Curriculum and Instruction, Educational Leadership P-12 Concentration or Disabilities Studies
- Be pursuing your first Undergraduate, Teaching Credential or Master's Degree
- Meet certain academic achievement requirements:
 - Scored above the 75th percentile on SAT, ACT or GRE... **OR**
 - (Undergraduate students) have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25
 - (Credential students) Received a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 from undergraduate coursework (Does not include Pre-Credential coursework) ... **OR**
 - (Graduate students) Received a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 from undergraduate coursework
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 for each term the TEACH Grant is received
- Complete the TEACH Grant Counseling at <https://studentaid.gov>
- Complete and sign a TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve at <https://studentaid.gov>

What are the terms and conditions?

- You must complete the TEACH Exit Counseling requirements once you complete the Teaching Credential Program or are no longer enrolled
- You must serve as a high-qualified full-time teacher at a low-income school or educational service agency for at least four academic years within eight years after you complete or cease to be enrolled in the program(s) for which you received TEACH Grant funds
- Your teaching service must be in a high-need field at an elementary school, secondary school or educational service agency
- You must provide documentation of your progress toward completing your service obligation to the U.S. Department of Education
- If you do not meet the requirements of your service obligation, all TEACH Grant funds you received will convert into a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan, with interest accrued and capitalized from the date of original disbursement

Can a TEACH Grant service obligation ever be suspended or cancelled?

- You can request a temporary suspension of the eight-year period for completing your TEACH Grant service obligation based on specific situations
- Your TEACH Grant may be cancelled due to failure to complete the required teaching service obligations
