

MEET OUR ECS FACULTY:

Happy Spring Semester ECS Students! If I haven't met you yet I am looking forward to getting to know you! I am Lauren Chase, faculty for the Early Childhood Studies program with the School of Education as well as Ventura College in the Child Development Program.

As long as I can remember I have worked with children and knew I would have a career in the field of Education. In middle school I was an aid for a previous teacher of mine and she put me as a facilitator for weekly small group book clubs. I will always remember her telling me I had a "knack for teaching," her words stuck with me all these years as well as the understanding that educators have the potential to have a lifelong impact on us.

I grew up in Ventura County and completed my Bachelor's Degree in the Early Childhood Studies Program from California State University, Channel Islands (CSUCI) in 2011. Throughout my time in college and beyond I worked in preschools full time while studying to earn my BA degree in ECS. I have worked in local preschools serving infants, toddlers, preschool and school-age children. I started as a teacher aid in a preschool classroom, worked my way up to lead teacher and site supervisor for a time. Upon graduating from CSUCI I knew I wasn't done learning so I moved on to California State University, Northridge to earn my MA in Educational Psychology emphasizing in Early Education. I wrote my thesis on curiosity in the classroom and how that relates to children's learning and motivation. While working on obtaining my degree I served on the local chapter of the Association for the Education of Young Children as accreditation chair from 2011-2013. During that time, we put on networking events for members and connected with local families, teachers in programs and family child care.

I began my career in higher education in 2014 at Ventura College and then joined CSU Channel Islands as faculty in Fall 2015 first as a Student Teaching Supervisor and then teaching courses the following semester. I have been married since 2015 right before starting my career at CI. We have two small children Amelia (3) and Jack, who will be a whole year old in April. I have grown so much during my time at CI, first as a student and then as an educator. Outside of CI I am an ongoing home decorator, always tinkering with my house and beginning new DIY's. Since the start of the pandemic I am a stay at home/work from home mom which at times is difficult (and quite distracting) but incredibly rewarding- I have even taught class with one on my lap or hip! I love to read, and have recently really started to love and learn how to keep a vegetable garden- we are reaping the benefits of our winter garden now, mustard greens, beets, carrots, broccoli and more.
