I have also worked with infants/toddlers (where I became a certified trainer for Programs for Infants and Toddlers, West Ed., California Dept Education). I have been a Curriculum Specialist, an Early Head Start Partnership Coordinator, and a Mentor Coach to Head Start teachers.

In my 13 years of working with children, families, and students, I feel that the most foundational component of teaching with any age group, is relationships. Through positive relationships, you can ensure a sense of safety and emotional well-being. This leads to good communication and a strong sense of trust.

On a personal note, I am the mom of three adult children and one granddaughter who is 4 years old. If you are in any of my classes, you will hear a lot about Austen's antics! I am an avid hiker and love the beach. I never go to either place without a backpack, as I am always collecting Loose

Parts. If you are not familiar with Loose Parts, I highly suggest looking up Miriam Beloglovsky, who is the author. I am also a life - long learner and read many books. An interesting thing about me, is the I ran the Marine Corp Marathon in Washington DC 10 years ago.
