Bilingual Authorization Concentration

The Bilingual Authorization Concentration will help prepare students to add the Bilingual Authorization to their preliminary teaching credential. Students will gain background knowledge on teaching and learning in bilingual and multicultural school settings, including in dual language bilingual education classrooms, research-based theories and practices informing bilingual education, and the relationship of culture and language in bilingual programs.

Special Grade Requirements: All courses in this concentration must be completed with a grade of C or better to be counted towards a Bilingual Authorization.

EDML 417 - The Socio-Cultural Context of Bilingual Schooling Units: 3

Complete one course from the following:

CHS/EDUC 349 - Chicana/os, Latina/os, and Education Units: 3

CHS/HIST 350 - Chicana/O History and Culture Units: 3

CHS/HIST 402 - Southern California Chicana/o History and Culture Units: 3

CHS/EDUC 445 - Chicano Child and Adolescent Units: 3

HIST 361 - History of Modern Latin America Units: 3

Once you are in a Credential Program, you will take two additional credential-level courses, EDML 563 and EDML 564. There are other requirements to obtain a Bilingual Authorization which will be explained when you enter a credential program.
